Our Grand Exalted Ruler Robert Duitsman's Elks National Foundation per member goal for 2019-2020 will continue at \$4.75. Wyoming is currently ranked 46th in the nation with \$2.04 per member in donations as of September 23, 2019. Congratulations to Lusk Lodge who has met the per member goal and is now at \$28.42. Most Lodges have sent in donations to the Elks National Foundation and we thank you for donating. Other Lodges are on their way in donating, but some lodges have a significant job ahead of them in order to make the GER goal. I'm hopeful that each and every one of you will again join your Elks brothers and sisters in meeting our Wyoming Elks National Foundation per member goal.

The Elks National Foundation total programs budget this year is \$34.6 million. Thanks to the generosity of Wyoming Elks in 2018-2019, Wyoming received **\$2.04** in exchange for every dollar donated. Wyoming donated \$45,641.96 to the Elks National Foundation and received back \$93,380 in disbursements to the Wyoming Elks Association to help fund our major project as well as Wyoming Scholarships, Hoop Shoot, Drug Awareness, Soccer Shoot, Veterans and Grants.







Frontier Days Water-Booth report Wyoming Elks Association Fall Meeting October 11-12 Jackson, WY.

Association President Tharpe, Members all.

This year established a new high mark for the Water-booth. We used slightly more than 29,000 cups, plus refilling countless personal water bottles. We reported 278 Elk volunteer hours 16.5 Non-Elk volunteer hours and 2,155 Elk miles. It would be nice if we could actually keep count of the persons served, but from opening to closing, it is simply too busy to take time to count.

Many of the patrons served offered a grutuity which was rejected, but I am thinking that as Water-booth expenses rise, maybe we should accept tips to help defray the expense. Along these lines, I'm considering, if the Association approves, placing a tip container bearing a sign reading, "Gratuities accepted. Proceeds will be used to fund Community Activities like this Water-booth."

Ice is another item of significant expense. This year \$460.00 went to Check's Ice Company. Since we have a freezer in the booth, I am going to try freezing our own ice blocks. The Dollar Tree store has plastic containers w/lids that would make a suitable size block of ice for one cooler refill. By starting several days early, we could have many blocks frozen by start-up and by continuously refilling the containers we might eliminate this expense entirely.

This endeavor has proven to be a significant Public Affairs activity and has boosted the Elks image among a large segment of the Frontier Days population. We offer a much needed service and our efforts are greatly appreciated by all but those vendors charging \$4.50 per bottle of water.

The attendance at this convention ranges from around 100 to 150.

Mid – Winter Convention: This is the hardest convention to host but also the most rewarding convention to host. This convention will have the Grand Exalted Ruler in attendance. At this convention a lodge will need to host the Ritual Contest and Flag/11 o'clock toast (arraignments need to be set up with the Ritual Chair prior to event). The local lodge is responsible for rooms costs for traveling out of state ritual judges. On Friday night the lodge will host the annual PER banquet and action, this requires the local lodge to secure an auctioneer to conduct the auction (paid or volunteer). Secure a restaurant or plan on serving breakfast prior to the start of the business session for dignitaries and members on Saturday morning. The attendance at this convention ranges from 100 to 150.

All Conventions: A gift basket should be placed in the rooms of visiting dignitaries (i.e. State Sponsor, Grand ER). The hosting Lodge needs to work with the State President to ensure all dignitaries have an escort for the convention. The attached form needs completed and turned into the Site Selection Committee on May 20, 2016 at 5:00 pm, a representative from the lodge placing a bid should be present.

Below is a breakdown of hospitality income and expenditures.

Alcohol & Sprits - \$730.61

Food - \$597.05

President Cups - \$308.38

Beer - \$300.39 (Tanager Beverages has agreed to reimburse the Association for the beer)

Jackalope - \$141.70

Total Expenses - \$2,078.13

Fee Income - \$175 per Lodge 15 paid = \$2,625.00

As you can see the income exceeded the expenses by \$546.97, plus the \$300.38 for beer costs that Tanager Beverages has agreed to refund. However, the owner of Tanager Beverages has been ill and the refund has not yet been received. Any G.L. Hospitality room reserves will be used to help with next year's expenses. However, we will monitor next year's income vs expenses and hopefully be able to lower the shared cost to each Lodge.


