Good Morning Members All:

Our Grand Exalted Ruler Paul Ryan's Elks National Foundation per member goal for 2020-2021 is at \$4.80. Wyoming is currently ranked 44th in the nation with \$1.20 per member in donations as of September 7, 2020. Congratulations to Lusk Lodge who has met the per member goal and is now at \$4.97. Most Lodges have sent in donations to the Elks National Foundation and we thank you for donating. Other Lodges are on their way in donating, but some lodges have a significant job ahead of them in order to make the GER goal. I am very hopeful that each and every one of you will again join your Elks brothers and sisters in meeting our Wyoming Elks National Foundation per member goal.

The Elks National Foundation total programs budget this year is \$34.1 million. Thanks to the generosity of Wyoming Elks in 2019-2020, Wyoming received **\$1.98** in exchange for every dollar donated. Wyoming donated \$48,465.84 to the Elks National Foundation and received back \$96,200 in disbursements to the Wyoming Elks Association to help fund our major project as well as Wyoming Scholarships, Hoop Shoot, Drug Awareness, Soccer Shoot, Veterans and Grants.

Community Investments Program: Every year on April 1, Elks National Foundation opens the Community Investment Program Grants. This year, the pandemic was unfolding across the country, making grant projects and planning virtually impossible. Instead of opening all five CIP grants on April 1, only the Gratitude Grant, was available for \$2,000. Most Elk Lodges stepped up across the country by donating their Gratitude Grant funds to organizations working on the front line of the pandemic. June 1, the Spotlight Grant opened and Elk Lodges were able to donate the fund directly to an organization equipped to serve populations in need that is affected by the pandemic. Beacon Grant launched August 1, \$3,500 which is an increase of 40 percent over last year.

Scholarships 2020-21: Most Valuable Student Scholarship applications opened August 5, Legacy Scholarship Awards started September 1. The most Valuable Student Scholarship is for any U.S. citizen high school senior. 
We need District Chairs for this committee in the Southwest and Northwest districts. If this interests you, please let myself or Barbette know!





I am hoping that everyone is doing well during this COVID-19 pandemic. Unfortunately, the Elks National Foundation has decided to shorten the 2020-2021 Hoop Shoot season. There will be only Local and District Contests (prior to March 31, 2021) – there will not be State, Regional, or National Contests. Contests should not be held if they cannot be done safely; Directors are empowered to make decisions that work for them and their communities.
