So at the end of December, I was excited to receive my Snap-on toolbox from storage. There was nobody around after work to help me put it away. I grabbed Tom Wasserburger's skid loader and was moving the toolbox to a storage building. Being that the toolbox is heavy (1200 lbs before the tools inside it) and valuable (\$10,000) I was moving it carefully. When the toolbox fell off of the forks and onto it's back, denting and scratching it, I was beyond frustrated. When I noticed that two drawers had opened and had been bent I was beyond angry. I got out of the skid loader and removed the doors from the box and picked it up putting it back onto the forks. I got it placed in storage. I felt sick angry and my leg/groin was sore. After a few days I went to the doctor and was checked for the signs of a hernia. She gave me some meds and told me to come back if I was still in pain after a week. I went back to the Dr. and she had some x-rays taken nothing seemed wrong with the x-rays but she gave me a referral to Ortho, who I saw the next day. He didn't see anything either and said that If my pain continued to call him and that he would schedule a MRI of my leg/groin. He also said I should get some crutches and not put any weight on my leg. He suggested that I get reexamined by the Dr. for sighs of a hernia. Went back to Dr. and she took x-rays of back and rechecked me for a hernia, negative. Had my MRI and the Ortho Dr. called me that evening told me to use the crutches and not to put any weight on my leg. It turns out that I had a stress fracture of my femur just below the ball joint. The Dr. was surprised that I had put so much force on my femur to crack it. He had checked with a radiologist to confirm it. The Dr. stressed not to put any weight on the leg until it heals and informed me that I was lucky it didn't break requiring surgery. I was walking around on it broken/cracked leg for the first few weeks of the year including the mid-winter convention. I was in a lot of pain and was off work until the third week of March. After returning to work, Lore' and I worked on our lodge's Easter Egg Hunt. After some miscommunication, Lore' and I attended the Elks State Budget meeting. I have been attending American Legion, Elks and Vfw Meetings. I'm also looking to the Grand Lodge Meeting in July.

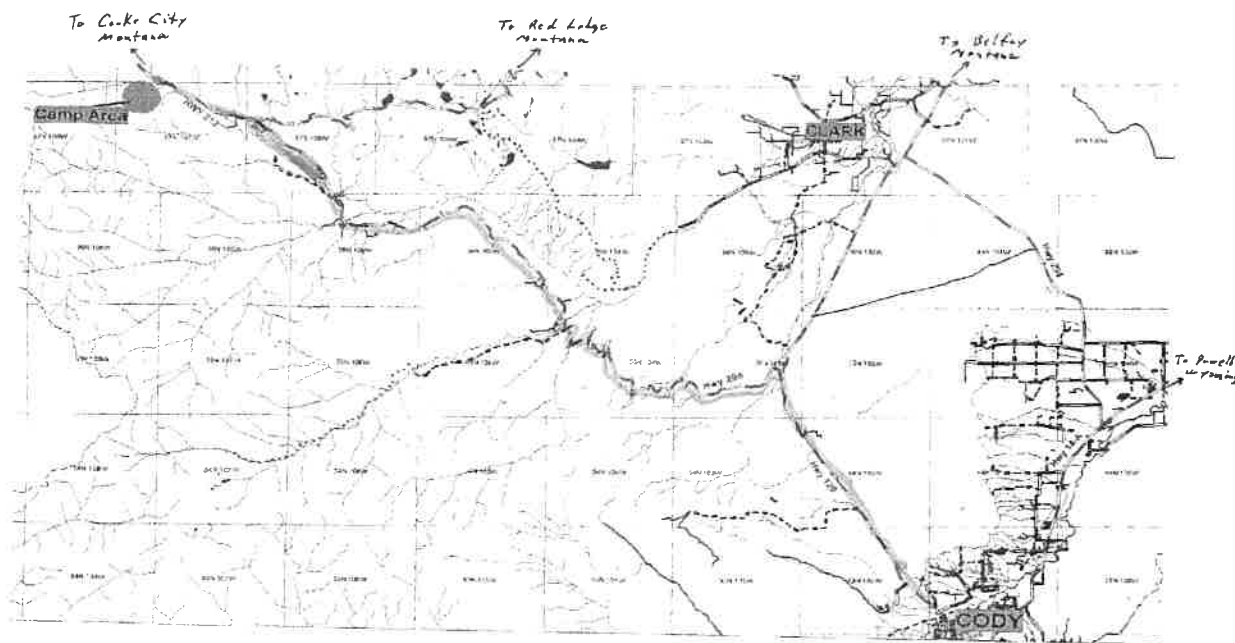

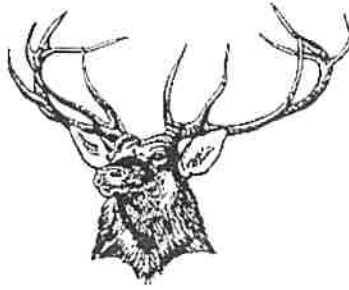
Below is a map to the site for Sept. 2019. Marilyn Lane Chairman

SPRING CONVENTION – Treasurers Report

The following pages indicate how the financial picture for the Wyoming Elks Association currently looks. Some of the accounts (especially the checking accounts) show some variation from meeting to meeting and on a yearly basis, which is pretty normal and to be expected. Our Investment accounts also show some significant variations typically due to the market fluctuation, which thankfully has been on the up-swing lately.

One area of concern I have is the ENF funds we had inherited due to not utilizing all the funding the ENF had provided Wyoming for several years, and the lack of getting the balance reduced this past year. Despite our efforts in funding Community Grants to nearly every Lodge, the balance in those reserves doesn't seem to be decreasing as the Trustees had planned for the past year. I, and I am pretty sure the Trustees will agree, think every Lodge needs to get on board to try to initiate events and programs within their Lodge that will qualify for ENF Funding, so we don't end up losing the support the ENF has to offer Wyoming each year.

On the bright side, we did receive several applications for the Elks Angels Scholarships this year, so we will be helping 12-14 students with continuing their education. A HUGE thank you to McGoo and everyone associated with the Elks Angles Program in finally getting the ball rolling on providing funding for the children of Wyoming Veterans that have served our country in the War on Terror. I am certain the kids that receive these scholarships are very appreciative.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as State Treasurer this past year and if everything goes according to plan, I hope to serve you all as Treasurer in the coming year.
