Good Morning Members All:

Thanks to the generosity of Wyoming Elks in 2021-2022, Wyoming received **\$2.11** in exchange for every dollar donated. Wyoming donated \$43,220 to the Elks National Foundation and received back \$91,350 in disbursements to the Wyoming Elks Association to help fund our major project as well as Wyoming Scholarships, Hoop Shoot, Drug Awareness, Soccer Shoot, Veterans and Grants. Through our Community Investments Program for 2021-22 fiscal year Elks National Foundation awarded a total of \$105,500 to 14 Wyoming Lodges.

Our Grand Exalted Ruler Bruce Hidley's Elks National Foundation per member goal for 2022-2023 is again at \$4.80. Wyoming is currently ranked 44th in the nation with \$2.18 per member in donations as of August 27, 2022. The four Lodges who have met the per member goal are; Jackson, Lusk, Casper and Gillette. Most Lodges have sent in donations to the Elks National Foundation and we thank you for donating. Other Lodges are on their way in donating, but some lodges have a significant job ahead of them in order to make the GER goal. I am very hopeful that each and every one of you will again join your Elks brothers and sisters in meeting our Wyoming Elks National Foundation per member goal.

Community Investments Program: Every year on April 1, the Elks National Foundation starts opening the Community Investment Program Grants: Spotlight Grant for \$2,000, Gratitude Grant for \$2,000 and the Beacon Grant for \$3,500. These three grants all opened April 1 with the deadline closing January 17, 2023. The Elks National Foundation is encouraging Lodges to think about donating to food pantries or other local organizations that are better equipped to directly serve the populations in need affected by the pandemic when applying for these three grants. 

Robert Logrhy, the Cheyenne 660 Club Manager, let us abuse their ice machine which saved us about \$500.00 in ice expense. Volunteers came from far and wide to help accumulate 408 Man-hours, 11,646 miles driven and \$400 in-kind donations. Thanks to John and Carol Vermilye for providing Camper space for volunteers to utilize.

About 3 years ago the motion was made, seconded and voted upon to allow a donation box at the booth. I hadn't acted upon that motion until this year when our Grand-daughter's husband welded up a real nice donation box for us. The proceeds from that box amounted to \$1,143.22 of which I withheld \$807.26 reimbursement and the remaining \$335.96 has been submitted to the State Association.

Next year's operation should go a little smoother as we now have an ice machine for the booth. It won't produce all our ice, but it certainly should significantly reduce the amount of ice we have to haul in.

WYOMING ELKS ASSOCIATION AUDIT REPORT Year Ended 4/30/22

September 17, 2022

President Rex Tollman, Past Grand Exalted Ruler Michael T Luhr, Distinguished Guests, Members All:

The compilation reports for the year ended April 30, 2022 for the Wyoming Elks Association, The Wyoming Elks Charitable and Benevolent Fund (WEST), and The Wyoming Elks Charitable Trust were completed by Cynthia M Rankin, Certified Public Accountant with Whittle, Hamilton & Associates of Powell and Cody Wyoming on August 25, 2022.

Cynthia reports that she performed a compiliation engagement in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services promulgated by the Accounting and Review Services Committee of the ATCPA. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the income tax basis.

The State Association net assets decreased by \$11,383.00 from the prior year. Per capita income decreased by \$412.00 from the previous year. Total revenues for the year were \$99,561.00 and expenditures were \$67,954.00.

WEST shows a decrease in assets of \$60,602.00 from the prior year. The market value of WEST investments on April 30, 2022 was \$1,671,047.00. WEST income amounted to \$208,145.00. Expenses amounted to \$49,255.00 The Elks Angels investments are included in the WEST investment totals, amounting to \$31,773.

The Wyoming Elks Charitable Trust shows assets of \$162,476.00 of which all is temporarily restricted, to be expended in the ensuing years. Income from the Elks National Foundation was \$65,760.00, a decrease of \$800.00 from the prior year. Expenses amounted to \$63,430,00.

It should be noted that the decrease in assets for the Wyoming Elks Association and WEST were from reporting the unrealized losses on investments.

All Form's 990 have been filed electronically. Secretary Jerry Fritz, as well as I have copies of the compilation available for any member wishing to review.

A motion to accept the compilation reports is needed.

I recommend Cynthia Rankin to complete the compilation reports for the three entities of the Wyoming Elks Association for the year ending 4/30/2023.

The Third Vice-President shall be elected alternating between the East District and the West District annually. If events outlined in Article VI Section 11, Subpart (c) come into effect, Section 11 sub part (c) shall supersede Section 2 and the Third Vice President may be elected from any Lodge of the Association.

Proposal if the State Secretary does not receive any resume's for an Office

Currently Reads

Section 11. A member in good standing in any lodge which is a member of this Association shall be eligible for any office of the Association subject to the following:

- a. All candidates for President, Frist Vice-President, Second Vice-President, and Third Vice-President must be a Past Exalted Ruler of a member lodge; and
- b. All candidates for Treasurer must be knowledgeable on accepted bookkeeping practices.
- c. All candidates for Third Vice-President must submit a resume' stating their qualifications for Third Vice-President and past accomplishments in the Association. Letters must be presented to the State Secretary no later than ten (10) days prior to the Mid-Winter Meeting that precedes the Annual Spring Convention at which the election will be held.

- d. All candidates for an elective office of the Association must present a letter of support from their home Lodge signed by the current Exalted Ruler and Secretary of that Lodge and a personal letter of intent to be a candidate for that office. Letters must be presented to the State Secretary no later than ten (10) days prior to the Mid-Winter Meeting that precedes the Annual Spring Convention at which the election will be held, in order that the State Secretary can read all letters of intent at that Mid-Winter Meeting business session.
- e. Any candidate for Secretary must interview with the President, Vice-Presidents and/or Trustees if deemed necessary by those Officers and/or Trustees after their letter of intent to run for Secretary is read at the Mid-Winter Meeting but prior to the election of Officers at the Annual Spring Convention.
- f. Any candidate for Secretary who has not served as Secretary of the Wyoming Elks Association must submit a resume' stating their qualifications for the office of Secretary and past accomplishments in the Association. Letters must be presented to the State Secretary no later than ten (10) days prior to the Mid-Winter Meeting that precedes the Annual Spring Convention at which the election will be held.
- g. Any candidate for Treasurer must interview with the President, Vice-Presidents and/or Trustees if deemed necessary by those Officers and/or Trustees after their letter of intent to run for Treasurer is read at the Mid-Winter Meeting but prior to the election of Officers at the Annual Spring Convention.
- h. Any candidate for Treasurer who has not served as Secretary of the Wyoming Elks Association must submit a resume' stating their qualifications for the office of Treasurer and past accomplishments in the Association. Letters must be presented to the State Secretary no later than ten (10) days prior to the Mid-Winter Meeting that precedes the Annual Spring Convention at which the election will be held.

Faces have changed, but mantra of helping others hasn't as BPOE 1431 readies for 100th

By Marlys Good

BPOE 1431 of Greybull is celebrating its 100* birthday. A gala is planned on Saturday, July 16 – an all-day social with guests expected from all around "Elkdom."

We talked about its earliest history dating back to the late 1800s, it took several decades to take root in our small town.

To look at its earliest origins in Greybull, we turned to Tom Davis and "Glimpses of Greybull's Past" and to some long-ago Greybull Standards, now yellowed with age.

Davis wrote: "In 1921, there were many men in Greybull who wanted to form an Elks Lodge, but they were dismayed to learn that the national Elks organization required a town to have 5,000 people before a lodge could be formed. These men believed that Greybull had 'almost 5,000 people,' so they formed an organization named the 'Antlers Club,' and started to count and count and count.

(Unofficially, the Antlers Club was called the 'Stray Elks.')

"The local members of the Antlers Club have arranged to take a census of the city and issue a directory. A very thorough canvass is to be made and indexed carefully, all of which will be gotten out in a handy book form which will be valuable to the businessman as a ready reference for not only the names of persons, but also their phone number and street number... (Greybull Standard 6/3/21)."

Davis said in "Glimpses" that "a history of the Greybull Elks Lodge and how it came to be founded was ably told by Fred Koschel, secretary of the lodge. The organization of the Greybull Lodge had its beginning when a group of 'stray' Elks formed an Elks Club. ... Even though the club had a sizeable membership, a charter could not be granted because at that time an Elks Lodge could not be formed in a city of less than 5,000 population. Mr. Koschel explained. A census of Greybull was compiled by the Big Horn Antlers and when completed in 1922 it showed that Greybull had a population of 5,341 persons. That the directory figures might have been 'padded' was hinted at by Mr. Koschel. Shortly after this directory had been presented as Exhibit A at the Los Angeles Elks national convention, a charter was granted for the organization of the Greybull Elks Lodge in February 1922."

Davis said, "While it is doubtful that Greybull ever had 5,000 or more residents during either 1921 or '22, it is very likely that Greybull was home to far more than 2,602 residents in that period"

In 1979, Joe Carey said in an interview, "I think that what they (Antlers) done was to count the floating population, plus the salesmen and everybody else that come in here, see? They'd go to the hotels and get all the people on the register at the time and class them as natives.

Members of Sheridan Elks Lodge 520 came to Greybull and initiated 54 candidates into Greybull Lodge 1431, electing, installing Ed Lander as exalted ruler and LeRoy Joyce as secretary. A charter was granted on July 13, 1922. (Thanks to Ray Valasek for sharing an old GS that relayed this information.)

History does not tell us where the Elks held their first meetings from 1922 to 1934. However, from 1934 through 1937, meetings were held in a building located on the corner of Fourth Avenue North and North Fourth Street. Construction on a new lodge located downtown on the corner of Greybull Avenue and Railroad Avenue began in 1937 and was completed in 1938.

A new addition was added in 1968. The original lodge was sold to Atwood & Atwood in 2004; the new addition was retained as the present Elks Lodge.

It remains a charitable and giving institution, as it has been since its inception. The major change was in 1995 when it opened its membership to women, one of the first of the 2,000-plus lodges in the United States to do so after a Supreme Court verdict was handed down. The move came smoothly to the local lodge; nationwide it was questioned and opposed for several more years. However, in 2002, the non-discrimination ruling was accepted and adopted nationwide

The first woman to be initiated into the local Elks Club was Cathy Frautschi on De. 30, 1998.

Lynna Smith and Colette Denniston were initiated into the lodge on Feb. 24, 1999.

The transition was smooth; women were welcomed as an integral part of BPOE 1431.

As of June 28, 2022, current officers are. Exalted Ruler, Jeff Sukut; Leading Knight Brant Ogg; Loyal Knight, Bobby Werner; Lecturing Knight, Pam Valasek; Secretary, Gretchen Kelso; Treasurer, Brenda Miller: Tyler: Chris Ogg; Chaplain: Deanna Werner; Esquire: Breanna Laird; Inner Guard: Jim Clifton.

Trustees include: 5-year Ted Peterson; 4-year Sherri Wilkinson; 3-year Lawrence Griffin; 2-year Jake Holtheus; 1-year Donna Dalin.

The lodge sends out a quarterly newsletter and Wilkinson, who compiles the report, said it is sent to approximately 325 Elks, going all over the United States, even as far as Hawaii. Once an Elk, always an

Elk," she said, noting that when a member of BPOE 1431 leaves, he/she takes the membership and is welcome at any Elks Lodge worldwide.

So while in little ways Elkdom has changed, its most important missions have remained the same.

Some new programs have been added, like the backpack programs in the schools.

The yearly scholarships that have been granted students in Greybull, Riverside, Burlington and Lovell high schools have benefitted dozens and dozens of seniors with thousands of dollars allocated (seven different scholarships) plus the (Jerry Schmer scholarship). The Elks honor and remember veterans at the two retirement centers; help with the annual Christmas Basket program; host the annual Hoop Shoot; provide funding for local youth sports programs and hold charity fundraisers.

They have also opened their doors for the lodge to be used for a voting precinct, host the community blood drives several times a year, provide a Veterans Day meal and hold a Flag Day ceremony every

June 14.

In a "yellowed with age" Greybull Standard from decades ago, we repeat: "The mantra is: Being an Elk is not what the Elks do for you, but what Elks do for the community." A hundred years later that mantra remains the same.

Happy birthday, BPOE 1431.

Enclosed is a form for you to complete and return so we can make proper hotel arrangements for your state delegation. Please give us your best judgement on sleeping room needs, meal functions, receptions or any activities that will require public/meeting space. All public space needs must be included on this form to assure proper placement in hotels with appropriate space. We must have this form in our office by August 24, 2022. This information must be in writing. NO ROOM BLOCKS WILL BE TAKEN OVER THE PHONE. Please fax, mail or email the form before August 24, 2022.

State hotel assignments will be completed in *Early November*. Do not contact hotels prior to receiving official written notification of hotel assignments from the Convention Office.

A six-year history, including 2022, lists the number of rooms originally requested and final number of rooms picked up by your state based on the peak night. If your state used more than one hotel in 2022 the number includes all properties. Please realize that the convention office has made every effort to get an accurate count of your total room pickup by contacting the hotels in which your state was housed. We currently do not have a hotel pick up report from the Atlanta Marriott Marquis but will supply the information to the states housed at the Marriott as soon as it is available.

Hotels have inserted performance clauses into contracts, which means simply we must make reasonable estimates of needs. These clauses assist both buyer and seller. By living up to the agreements we are alerting the hotels to have adequate staff and rooms available. The hotels must then also live up to agreements. If we fall below these estimates, based on the following paragraph, state programs will be impacted.

There are financial fees applied for each room block below 80%. With each Hotel assignment, you will be informed of that Hotel's Attrition Clause.

Keep in mind the block submitted now is the state association's responsibility. If you request adjustments later, every effort will be made to accommodate the request. But the state will still be responsible to pick up 80% of the **original block**.

Hotels have every right to expect us to be realistic in our requests. Good rates comp rooms and suites reward these efforts, while higher rates and loss of comps will certainly follow if we fail. As you complete the form view your records for checkouts as early as

Tuesday and Wednesday of the convention week this may affect your comp situation. Be sure to include the State Presidents Suite in your room request. As a general rule of thumb count this suite as 2 rooms.

Daily requests mean that if you require 100 rooms for the final Tuesday and 20 rooms for Wednesday, then 80 rooms should be listed in the departure column for Wednesday.

Any state event requiring meeting space must be listed in the attached form. We run the risk of over lapping events, and the hotel not having adequate space available for multiple events. 
