### Wyoming State Elks Association Mid-Winter Meeting, Jan 14th, 2023 W.E.A. Historians Report

President Tollman and Members All;

50 years ago - Mid-Winter Session was held January 26th, 27th and 28th, 1973 in Casper.

The meeting was opened by State President Dr. Richard W. Collins. Nothing was noted in notes about total attendance other than all lodges were present at roll call with the exception of Torrington Lodge #1726.

It was noted that 11 Past State Presidents were in attendance. Grand Lodge members in attendance were; Grand Exalted Ruler Francis M. Smith, Past Grand Exalted Ruler H.L. Blackledge, District Deputy Wyoming North Oliver Foust, District Deputy Wyoming South Roger Percival and Grand Lodge Committeeman Art Drehle.

Grand Lodge was held in Chicago, July 15th, 1973.

Nothing was noted about what the ENF goal was per member, however there appears to have been a spirited speech given by ENF State Chairman Paul Cody. He states, "Wyoming Elks appear to have lost enthusiasm for the Elks National Foundation, and this can be directly attributed to the Exalted Rulers and Officers of the various lodges." He went on to lament about Wyoming being ranked 40th in ENF contributions. The remarks by Mr. Cody must have sparked a lengthy discussion as noted by the State Secretary in the official notes.

Roger Percival DDGER Wyoming South gave a report on new lodges. At this time he introduced Brother Ralph Freeman. Mr. Freeman had been a member of Ainsworth Nebraska Lodge #1790 and had been transferred to the Gillette area for work. Mr Freeman reported that there was significant interest in Gillette, a town of 7,500 at that time, to form a lodge. Mr. Freeman had also been recommended by W.K. Rynearson, President of the Nebraska Elks Association to help in the founding of the new lodge.

Mr. Freeman described his plans in detail and asked for some financial assistance from the state association for advertising and catering some meetings.

Mr. Percival then made mention that they had also been working in the Evanston - Kemmerer area about starting a lodge.

One final humorous note from this convention came in the remarks from Grand Exalted Ruler Francis M. Smith, Sioux Falls, S.D. Lodge #112. He made a simple request to the association that perhaps in the future, the ritual contest could be held at a later hour as the combination of the early hour, his age and the night before made for a terrible sacrifice. The secretary notes that the remarks were met with rapturous laughter from the hall.

25 years ago - The Mid-Winter meeting was held January 17th, 1999 in Casper. The meeting was opened by State President Robert Hague, Riverton Lodge #1693. This meeting was well attended by several dignitaries. Among them were GER Carlon O'Malley, Scranton, Penn Lodge #123, PGER and Grand Lodge Sponsor George B. Klein, Lincoln, Ne Lodge #80, Special Deputy David Barker, Cheyenne Lodge # 660, Grand Lodge Committeeman for Public Relations Brad Bochman, Casper Lodge #1353, East District Deputy Jim Kremers, Lusk Lodge # 1797, NW District Deputy Harold Ogg, Greybull Lodge #1431, SW District Deputy Robert Pryor, Evanston Lodge # 2588, New Mexico State President Lowell Stephens, Alamogordo, NM Lodge #1897 and Nebraska State President Darrell Henderson, York, Ne. Lodge # 1024. Total in attendance was 118.

Grand Lodge was held in Anaheim, California July 19-23, 1998.

ENF had a goal of \$3.51 per member.

This meeting appears to have been impacted by awful winter weather. It was noted that the business meeting started nearly two hours later than scheduled because the snow was so bad and many people had not yet arrived. It was also noted that this was the first meeting after the association had implemented the pre-filing of reports and the weather that they were experiencing reinforced why the reports were requested to be pre-filed.

In future reports, I would like to get information from and about the lodges. I would like to feature one lodge per report and give a short history of each lodge. There doesn't need to be too much, just information such as what year it was granted its charter, if its building was built as a lodge or if they acquired an old building, anything that is unique to your lodge and that you would want people to know.

We really need some participation this year or we may need to consider using the funds in a different way. The plan is to get all local lodges to hold a contest during the summer months. Then we will host the State Contest in October or November. I have a goal (no pun intended) of at least 30% participation from the lodges. I would like to see an individual from both the East District and the West District take charge and make this happen. Below is information derived from the Elks Website.

Soccer is one of the fastest growing youth activities in the country. The Elks Soccer Shoot Program is geared to coincide with this sport phenomenon. From toddlers to teens, in our large urban centers to our small suburban settings, soccer is becoming the sport of choice for our youth. This program is the kind of sporting event to help keep our youth focused and away from undesirable activities.

The Elks Soccer Shoot program consists of two different contests that test different level skills at different ages. A "Five Goal Contest" consists of a series of five goals, decreasing in size from 48 inches to 17 inches. The age group that uses the goals in this contest are U-8 for ages 7 years old and younger. The contest is open to boys and girls who shoot separately. The U-8 contestants kick from 15 feet from the face of the goal.

The Grid Goal Contest consists of a full-size goal sectioned off so points can be scored when the ball is kicked into certain sections. The age groups that use this goal are U-10, for ages eight and nine, U-12, for ages ten and eleven, and U-14, for ages twelve and thirteen. The contest is open to both boys and girls and they shoot separately.

Winners at each contest are eligible to advance to the next of competition. The levels are Local Lodge and State.

**Section 3.** If a vacancy occurs in the office of the Second Vice-President, the vacancy shall be filled from the District in which the Second Vice-President whose office has been vacated resides by nomination and election at a regular meeting of the Association or at a special meeting called for that purpose.

**Section 4.** If a vacancy occurs in the office of the Third Vice-President, the vacancy shall be filled from the District in which the Third Vice-President whose office has been vacated resides by nomination and election at a regular meeting of the Association or at a special meeting called for that purpose.

**Section 5.** If a vacancy occurs in the office of the Secretary or the Treasurer, the President shall, with the advice and consent of the Nominating and Advisory Committee, appoint a successor or successors to fill the unexpired term or terms of either or both of the vacant office(s).

**Section 6.** If a vacancy occurs in any other office in any other office, the President shall appoint a successor to fill the unexpected term of the vacant office.

**Section 7.** If a vacancy occurs on the Board of Trustees, the vacancy shall be filled by nomination and election at a regular meeting of the Association or at a special meeting called for that purpose. If the vacancy results from the death, resignation or removal of a Trustee who was elected by the District, the successor Trustee must be elected from that same District.

#### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

# WYOMING ELKS ASSOCIATION BENEVOLENT AND PROTECTIVE ORDER OF ELKS OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA A NON-PROFIT CORPORATION

SECRETARY OF STATE

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, the undersigned, have this 19th day of January, 1991, voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Wyoming, and we hereby certify:

FIRST: That the name of said non-profit corporation shall be "Wyoming Elks Association," of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America.

SECOND: The term of existence of this non-profit corporation will be perpetual.  $\overline{\omega}$ 

THIRD: That the purposes for which said Corporation is formed are:

- (a) The primary purpose for which this Corporation is formed is to inculcate the principles of Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity; to promote the welfare and enhance the happiness of its members; to quicken the spirit of American patriotism; to cultivate good fellowship and to perpetuate itself as a fraternal organization.
- (b) Other purposes for which this Corporation is formed are: to do all the acts and things, and business and businesses in any manner connected with the objects or purposes or powers of the corporation, or necessary, incidental, convenient or auxiliary thereto, calculated directly or indirectly to promote the interests, objectives, and ideals of the organization, and in addition, to have and exercise all rights, powers and privileges now or hereafter belonging to or conferred upon non-profit corporations existing under the laws of the State of Wyoming.
- (c) The foregoing statement of purpose of purposes shall be construed as a statement of both purposes and powers and the purposes and powers in each clause shall, except where otherwise expressed, be in no way limited or restricted by reference to or

inference from the terms of provisions of any other clause, but shall be regarded as independent purposes and powers.

FOURTH: (a) The Officers, Directors, and trustees of this corporation, their nominations, election or appointment, installation power and authority shall be in accordance with the provisions of the By-Laws of this Corporation, and said officers as they shall be duly elected or appointed shall have all powers allowed by law including §17-6-103 of the Wyoming statutes as the same may be amended from time to time.

- (b) The governing body of this corporation shall be its Board of Directors, which said Board of Directors shall consist of all of the following: the Officers of the Corporation, who are entitled President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, 3rd Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer and all persons who shall bear the title of Trustee.

EIGHTH: That the address of the principle office and the registered agent for the transaction of business of this corporation to be located Jack H. Cash, 2513 Beartooth Drive, Cody, Wyoming, 82414.

NINTH: This corporation is organized with the permission of Grand Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America, and the business of the Corporation and all its acts, decisions and other actions of its Officer and members in carrying out its purpose and powers shall at all times conform with the provisions of the Grand Lodge Constitution and Statutes of the Order enacted pursuant thereto as well as the provisions of State law.

TENTH: In all matters relating to property, both real and personal, including but not limited to purchase, sale, mortgage, hiring and leasing, the provisions of Section 16.050, Statutes of the Order relating to notice and required vote shall be fully complied with.
