### **House Committee Note**

Members All,

Just a guick reminder about the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Requirements: For Service Animals

Last updated; February 28, 2020, Under Title III (Public Accommodations and Commercial Facilities)

Beginning on March 15, 2011, only dogs are recognized as service animals under Title II and Title III the ADA state and local governments and non-profit organization that serve the public generally must allow service animals to accompany people with disabilities in all areas of the facility where the public is allowed to go.

The owner must keep the animal under control and on a harness, or leashed, or tethered. Please remember these are the ADA rules and regulations we must follow. Listed at ADA.gov, U.S. Department of Justice Civil Rights Division. Remember Elks Care, Elks Share.
